

## Youth Zone Shoot Player Information

(Read before play starts)

- 1. Spectators are to remain behind the tables. Cheering is acceptable, but please be respectful.
- Players are not to talk to spectators during play, as it could be perceived as coaching. There is no coaching unless there has been a coach assigned to a board. The assigned coach will help both players/teams if required.
- 3. (If it is the rules of the venue) There is no outside food or drinks in the venue.
- 4. The new NDFC bull rule is in effect:
  - a. Winner of the toss of a coin shall have the option to throw first or second for the bull, which occurs before the first leg of the match.
  - b. Any dart landing in the green bull (outer bull) or red bull (inner bull) shall be retrieved before any other darts are thrown for the bull. Any ties shall result in throwing for the bull again, in reverse order. Any dart landing outside of the bull area shall stay in the board for measurement if needed once all darts are thrown for the bull
  - c. Winner of the bull will shoot first in each odd numbered leg including any required deciding leg. The loser of the bull will shoot first in each even numbered legs
- 5. Cell phones must be off or on vibrate at all times.
- 6. Good sportsmanship must be the prevailing attitude throughout all tournaments.
- 7. When both players/teams are on or below the score of 40, a 5-minute timer will be set. The timer would be set after the second player/team gets to 40 or below, therefore the player/team getting to 40 or below first would be the first to shoot within the 5 minutes. If neither player/team has won the game at the end of the 5-minute timer, 9 darts per player will be thrown and high score will win the match. It is mandatory that each player/team has an equal number of visits/shots at the board. The player/team who shot first within the 5-minute timer will also be first to shoot for the 9-dart high score.
- 8. The following dress code will be in effect and strictly enforced at the Youth Provincial Championships: Business casual with a collared shirt that has a minimum of a cap sleeve is required. Shirts must be completely buttoned/zipped up. The following are not allowed: denim, athletic wear, shorts, skirts above the knee, open toe/heel shoes, hats, and headphones/earbuds. Western Ontario Darts Association representative's decisions are final.
- 9. Players must be present at the Provincials award ceremony to receive awards won.
- 10. If there are any issues during a game, stop play immediately and come to the control desk.
